1	Vaccinated Against COVID-19
	You will need to be vaccinated with WHO EUL vaccines (see the list <u>here</u>) before you can attend the COF, unless you are medically exempted and certified by a doctor.
2	Update Overseas Vaccination Status into Singapore National Immunisation Registry (NIR)
	If you are vaccinated overseas, you are required to have your vaccination records updated into Singapore NIR by a Singapore healthcare provider. Online Ingestion: If your vaccination certificate is <u>digitally verifiable</u> (e.g. containing a QR code that can be scanned to verify its authenticity)
	(e.g. containing a QN code that can be scanned to verify its dathenticity)
	You can have it verified online before you arrive in Singapore. Please contact one of the Singapore clinics and provide them the following documents. Please note that the full cost of the ingestion service will be borne by students.
	 Passport (Biodata Page) Digital Covid-19 Vaccination Certificate for ALL doses including the booster if any. Missing a document of any doses will cause delays. If your vaccination documents are not in English, you will need to get the documents translated by a translation service provider, notary public or embassy of the country that issued the documents. IPA (In-Principle Approval) Letter (Please ensure that your FIN number is clearly stated)
	Once your documents are verified, the doctor will update your information in the NIR. Please note that processing will take 1-3 working days. You may refer to the full listing of clinics <u>here</u> .
	If your vaccination certificate is not digitally verifiable
	You will need to visit a clinic upon arrival in Singapore to do a serology test (blood test). Please arrive in Singapore a few days before the COF to get your data ingested in time as the serology test result may take up to 5 working days to be updated.
	The doctor will update your vaccination records into NIR if your test result is positive. If your serology test result is negative, you will have to complete the full vaccination regimen in Singapore within two months of the negative test result.

3.	Medical Report (applicable to 1-year students only)
	Please ensure that you have your medical examination done as required, and upload the prescribed <u>Medical</u> <u>Examination Report</u> form and supporting documents onto the <u>ICA portal</u> .
